

Gale- Thank you for all your time talent and effort.



## BICENTENIAL COMMITTEE

The Bicentenial Committee met on Wednesday, Sept. 17th. Chairman Pat Greetham introduced the guest speaker, Mr. Norwin Burbidge of the Washington State American Revolution Bicentenial commission (WSARBC). In his talk, Mr. Burbidge reffered to Bicentenial celebrations of the Nation's birthday as being analogous to family celebrations of an individual's birthday in that the occasion is marked out of love and appreciation. He told about Bicentenial activities around the state.
