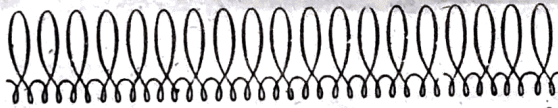
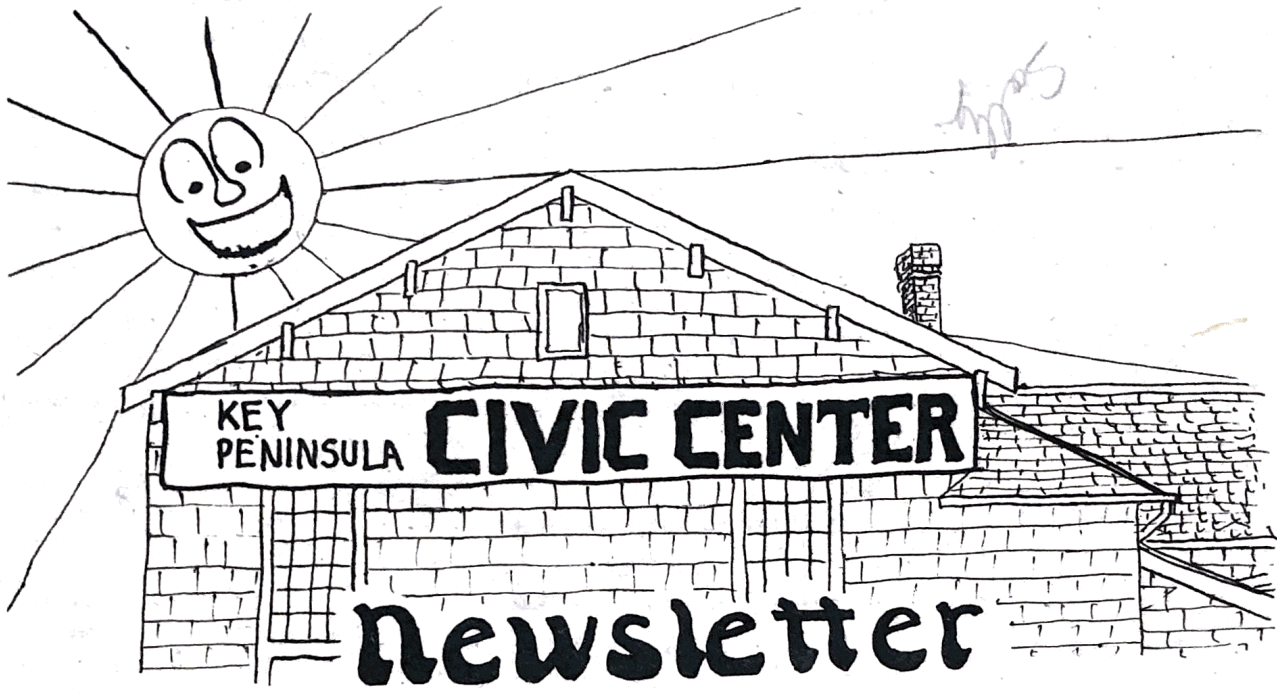

Gale- Thank you for all your time talent and effort.

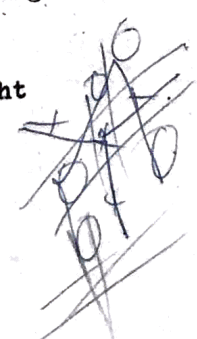
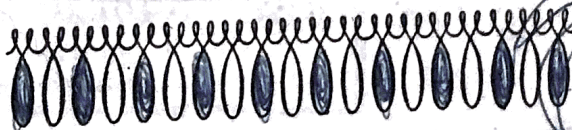
Both Larry and Gale have asked to be replaced.

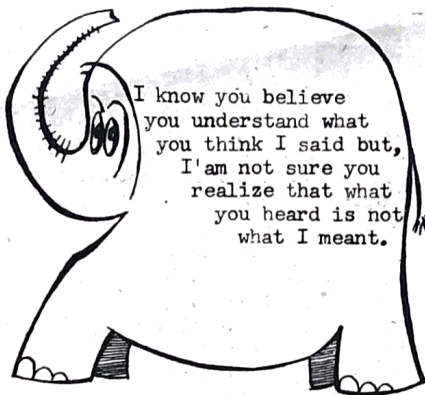

SQUARE DANCE NEWS

The Bicentennial Committee met on Wednesday, Sept. 17th. Chairman Pat Greetham introduced the guest speaker, Mr. Norwin Burbidge of the Washington State American Revolution Bicentennial Commission (WSARBC). In his talk, Mr. Burbidge referred to Bicentennial celebrations of the Nation's birthday as being analogous to family celebrations of an individual's birthday in that the occasion is marked out of love and appreciation. He told about Bicentennial activities around the state.

Yakima has purchased old cable cars and is now running them as a tourist attraction and also as part of the city bus system.

Tenino bought an abandoned railway station that was due for demolition. It has been moved to the city park and set up as a museum.

The DeLong school district neighbors in Tacoma built a park and constructed tennis courts.

The Allied Arts in Tacoma is sponsoring a Tour of Homes scheduled for Oct. 10th thru 13th.

A book has been published as a bicentennial project - "Washington State National Parks, Historic Sites, Recreation Areas and National Landmarks" by Ruth Kirk.

The above examples are some of the better efforts of citizens across the state to organize and develop their own projects to honor our Nation's Bicentennial. The Bicentennial has presented the catalyst with which to get these ideas out of the mind and into significant action.

Efforts toward a meaningful celebration on the Key Peninsula are progressing well under the leadership of Pat Greetham. The next meeting of the Bicentennial Committee will be on Oct. 15th at 7:30 in the Gold Room of the Civic Center.
